Student Support Fund

The Student Support Fund is designed for those who have received all their statutory funding but still find themselves facing financial hardship, particularly because of unforeseen circumstances. University bursary

In 2022/23 if you are a new University of Southampton student you could be eligible for a means tested award of up to £2,000 from the University. To be eligible you must be paying the undergraduate £9,250 tuition fee rate and have applied for a means-tested student loan from Student Finance. You or your parent(s) will need to provide their household information to Student Finance so the University can assess your eligibility for this award. The University will calculate and process any bursary that you may be eligible for once your application to Student Finance has been fully assessed and verified. The amount payable depends on the household income and the year in which you commenced your studies.
