About volunteering with SUSU:

In order to apply for the role, you must predominantly be based at NOCS campus. When applying for this role you are confirming that you meet the eligibility criteria for the role.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

While volunteering with the Union as a Site Officer, your role in this mission is described below.

Main Purpose of Role:

- To act as the lead representative for NOCS.
- 2) To ensure that student views on their study environment are acted upon.
- 3) To encourage participation in site-specific initiatives aimed at enriching the student experience.

Main Responsibilities of the Role

To act as the lead representative for NOCS

- To lead and provide the main point of contact for all students with queries or concerns relating to their time studying at NOCS.
- To obtain student feedback on a range of issues relating to the student experience at NOCS, passing any academic issues on to the relevant SUSU Academic Representative.
- To report on any changes and improvements to the student body, with an emphasis on those studying at NOCS.

To ensure that student views on their study environment are acted upon.

• To use a variety of means to collect views and opinions from students on both the Union and University offer at NOCS.

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- To meet regularly with the staff members responsible for managing and running NOCS to discuss potential improvements to the student experience.
- To regularly review student feedback alongside the University and identify further areas for improvement.

To encourage participation in site-specific initiatives aimed at enriching the student experience.

- To meet regularly with other NOCS-based SUSU representatives (such as Academic Reps) to discuss plan and projects being worked on.
- To encourage participation in SUSU insight activities, both at an institutional and sitespecific level.
- To encourage all students to participate in events at NOCS to foster a sense of community and belonging.
