

About volunteering with SUSU:

The Sports Participation Officer works to represent students who take part in Sporting activities while studying. This includes working to drive participation in sports across all our sites. You will also work with teams at SUSU and the University to help promote sports at Southampton.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

While volunteering with SUSU as our Sports Participation Officer, your role in this mission is described below.

Main Purpose of Role:

- 1) Chair the Sports Participation Committee (SPC)
- 2) Drive participation by making sports as welcoming and as accessible as possible
- 3) Promote a positive culture within sports at Southampton

Main Responsibilities of the Role

Chair the Sports Participation Committee

- *Ensure regular meetings are held by the committee*
- *Lead the planning and delivery of campaigns and projects run by the Sports Participation Committee*
- *Allocate the Sports Participation Committee budget to campaigns and projects that further the aims of the committee*

Drive participation by making sports as welcoming and as accessible as possible

- *Consult with under-represented groups in sports to understand the barriers they face with participation*
- *Deliver meaningful campaigns to raise awareness of the barriers in sports and provide new opportunities for students to take part in sport*
- *Highlight any existing opportunities for students to take part in sport and promote the benefits of an active lifestyle*

Promote a positive culture within sports at Southampton

- *With the help of the Athletic Union Committee and the sabbatical officers, encourage affiliated sports clubs to uphold SUSU and Team Southampton values*
- *Support relevant campaigns to improve welfare within sports clubs, such as #ExpectRespect and Sexual Consent Awareness week*
