About volunteering with SUSU:

Faculty Officers are the senior reps in their faculty and take overall responsibility for academic representation and report to the Union's Vice President Education and Democracy. They lead and manage their Department and School Presidents and are responsible for ensuring consistent and strong representation. They meet regularly with the Associate Dean (Education) for their Faculty and sit on Faculty Education meetings.

In order to apply for the role, you must be a student in that Faculty. When applying for this role you are confirming that you meet the eligibility criteria for the role.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

Main purpose of the role:

- 1) Acting as the lead representative for your Faculty
- 2) Facilitating a positive relationship between the University and student representatives
- 3) Encouraging participation in University-wide initiatives aimed at enriching the student experience

Main responsibilities of the role

Acting as the lead representative for your faculty Scrutinising the work of Sabbatical Officers

- Lead and provide the main point of contact for all the School and Department Presidents within your Faculty.
- Obtain student feedback on a range of issues relating to academic experience
- Feed back on any changes and improvements to the student body and VP Education and Democracy

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Facilitating a positive relationship between the University and student representatives

- Sit on Faculty Education & Student Experience Committee meetings
- Regularly review student feedback alongside the University and identify areas for improvement

Encouraging participation in University-wide initiatives aimed at enriching the student experience

- Meet regularly with other Academic Representatives to plan and share ideas
- Participate in University-wide consultations
