

About working with SUSU:

Our vision for the future is that every student loves their time at Southampton. We are here to represent the voice of students at every level and ultimately make their university experience unforgettable. Independent from the University, we're run by students, for students!

As a student-led organisation, the hard work and dedication of our student volunteers is vital to our mission.

As a Sabbatical Officer, you will lead the direction of the Union on a specific area of work, representing the view of the student body both within the Union and to the University. You will work in partnership with relevant Union and University Staff in all areas of work and will be held accountable to union members for your work and projects.

A Sabbatical Officer role is a **full time, paid position**, where you will hold office from 1st July for a period of 1 year. This list of duties is not exhaustive but presents an outline of the core duties and responsibilities of the role.

We provide full training throughout your term in office. You will gain a wealth of experience through your role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work that you accomplish.

Main purpose of the role:

- 1) Leading Team Southampton
- 2) Developing sporting performance
- 3) Encouraging participation in sport
- 4) Acting as a Trustee of the Union

Main responsibilities of the role

Leading Team Southampton

- *Support the running of Team Southampton Clubs: acting as president of Team Southampton, representing all affiliated sports clubs, and overseeing the grant allocation process.*
- *Advocate on behalf of these clubs to the University*
- *Lead on the Union's annual Varsity, Team Southampton Awards, and other sporting events throughout the year*

Developing sporting performance

- *Represent the institution within British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS)*
- *Work to improve sporting performance and elite sport at Southampton*
- *Work with the University to look at long term strategy with regards to sporting facilities*

Encouraging participation in sport

- *Encourage students to lead a healthy and active lifestyle and ensure all students have a fair opportunity to participate in sporting activity*
- *Lobby the University to make sport more accessible for all students*
- *Oversee the strategy of the Intramural league and promote student participation in Intramural sports*
