## About volunteering with SUSU:

The Wellbeing Officer to works prioritise student mental health at Southampton. You will also work with teams at SUSU and the University to help promote campaigns and activities about student mental health.

In order to apply for the role, you should have experience of helping/supporting students. When applying for this role you are confirming that you meet the eligibility criteria for the role.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

### Main purpose of the role:

- 1) To work to prioritise student mental health within the Union and University.
- 2) To promote a healthy lifestyle amongst students.
- 3) To support students with private housing issues.

## Main responsibilities of the role:

#### To work to prioritise student mental health within the Union and University

- To promote and signpost the support services offered by the Union and University to all students.
- To seek student feedback on mental health support and act on the feedback received, working with the VP Welfare & Community.
- To lobby the University to prioritise student mental health.

#### To promote a healthy lifestyle amongst students

- To raise awareness of ways to maintain a healthy lifestyle amongst students.
- To be a key contact between relevant societies and the VP Welfare & Community.
- To work with the VP Welfare & Community and Union staff on awareness-raising campaigns such as Expect Respect.

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#### To support students with private housing issues.

- To work to appropriately inform and signpost students about housing options, including working on events such as The Housing Fair.
- To ensure that there is relevant advisory information on housing, working with relevant Union staff and the VP Welfare & Community.
