

About working with SUSU:

Our vision for the future is that: **every student loves their time at Southampton.**

Independent from the University, we are here to represent the voice of students at every level and ultimately make their university experience unforgettable.

As a Sabbatical Officer, you are the key student leader who sets the direction of the Union on a specific area of work. Representing the view of the student body both within the Union and to the University. You will work in partnership with relevant Union and University Staff in all areas of work and will be held accountable to union members for your work and projects.

A Sabbatical Officer role is a **full time, paid position**, where you will hold office **from 1st July for a period of 1 year**. As a figurehead of SUSU you will be expected to be a public face of the Union, this includes but is not limited to online platforms, public speaking at various internal and external events, and within the University and wider Southampton Community. You may also be required to act as Trustee of the Union.

The main location for your role is on Highfield Campus, however you will be expected to travel to other campuses and sites as part of your role. You will also be expected to work outside of core office hours where the role requires, including some evening and weekend work.

We provide full training and support throughout your term in office. You will gain a wealth of experience through your role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work that you accomplish.

This list of duties is not exhaustive but presents an outline of the core duties and responsibilities of the role.

Main purpose of the role:

- 1) Representing our diverse student population
- 2) Representing the interests of international students
- 3) Advocating for students at international campuses
- 4) Leading on inclusion campaigns within the Union and the University

Main responsibilities of the role

Representing our diverse student population

- *Represent, support and amplify the voices of students with protected characteristics, working with liberation groups and underrepresented communities*
- *Advocate on behalf of these communities to the University, lobbying for equity, diversity and inclusion*
- *Work to increase student engagement in these communities*

Representing the interests of international students

- *Ensuring international students are represented and have a voice within the University*
- *Lobby the university over international students' issues and needs*
- *Support and work with international student communities and groups*

Advocating for students at international campuses

- *Advocating for students studying at International campuses to have access to the same opportunities*
- *Ensure students at international campuses have a voice within the University*
- *Work to ensure both the Union and University are delivering on both short and long term goals in supporting students on international campuses*

Leading on inclusion campaigns within the Union and the University

- *Support and facilitate events which celebrate diversity and inclusion, including liberation and awareness campaigns*
- *Increase student engagement in these campaigns ensuring relevant communities fed in*
- *Ensure accessibility and inclusivity of all the Union and Universities campaigns*
