

## About volunteering with SUSU:

A Postgraduate Research (PGR) Faculty Officer works alongside the PGR Faculty Officers in other faculties to represent Postgraduate Researchers to the Union and the University and to hold regular social events for PGRs to feel part of a community.

In order to apply for the role, you must be a PGR student from the relevant faculty. When applying for this role you are confirming that you meet the eligibility criteria for the role.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

## Main purpose of the role:

- 1) To represent PGR students from your faculty at University level.
- 2) To be a primary point of contact between SUSU and PGR students.
- 3) To attend PGR forums and other meetings relevant to PGR students.

## Main responsibilities of the role

### To represent PGR students from your faculty at University level

- To work with other PGR Faculty Officers, PGR Representatives, and the PGR community to ensure that PGR Students are represented at all levels of SUSU and the University.
- To co-chair faculty-level Student-Staff Liaison Committee (SSLC) meetings.
- To present the views of your peers to key academic and admin staff.

### To be a primary point of contact between SUSU and PGR students

- To work with relevant Sabbatical Officers and Union Staff to facilitate SUSU's Postgraduate Research offer to students.
- To promote SUSU's PGR survey to your peers so we can consistently collect feedback from PGR students across the university.
- To organise and promote SUSU events and campaigns relevant to PGR students.

### To attend PGR forums and other meetings relevant to PGR students

- To sit on relevant University boards for PGR-related topics.
- To attend forums or meetings organised by your faculty.
- To attend meetings or forums organised by SUSU or the Doctoral College.
